In the midst of conflict and upheaval their feud remains undimmed, before reaching a climax in the closing days of the Great War. Excerpts from captured Japanese diaries provide rare insight into the other side of the conflict.

The result: the first deadly car bombs in the country since 1936, a fatwa against the station's entire staff, a struggle for control of the kingdom, and, of course, interference from the French. And that's only the beginning. A merciless dismantling of both American ineptitude and Arabic intolerance, Florence of Arabia is Christopher Buckley's funniest and most serious novel yet, a biting satire of how U.S. good intentions can cause the Shiite to hit the fan.
